Message from the CEO

Strengthening the region

As we welcome February already, it is timely to recap on RDA Sunshine Coast's four key focus areas for 2019.

- **1. Advocacy for improved transport**: We will continue to work with all three levels of government to drive investment in improved transport infrastructure and smart-transport solutions.
- 2. Leveraging investment in the Sunshine Coast Airport expansion: The RDA is supporting the development of potential airport freight opportunities and export clusters at the Sunshine Coast Airport in partnership with the local Food and Agribusiness Network (FAN).
- 3. Supporting regional innovation, including leveraging the Sunshine Coast International Broadband Submarine Cable: We will identify and



communicate the regional benefits of the submarine cable and the economic opportunities that it provides, while continuing to promote the Coast as a destination for entrepreneurs.

4. Connecting businesses to opportunities: To maximise government grants in the region by better connecting local businesses to grant-writing services, available grants and grant writing tips.

We will also advocate for, lead, or participate in a number of key projects in the region, including:

- The Sunshine Coast Regional Innovation
 Pipeline Team (#SCRIPT): SCRIPT is a
 collaboration of local entrepreneurs, businesses,
 government stakeholders and community members
 dedicated to growing innovation and business
 capacity on the Sunshine Coast.
- **Reimagine Nambour**: This is an economic transition strategy which aims to unite government, community and business leaders around an action plan to transform the local economy while retaining Nambour's distinct cultural identity.
- The Ripple Effect: This project aims to ensure local SMEs are aware of opportunities generated by "game changer" projects across the Sunshine Coast region and to educate local businesses that they do not need to be in a directly-related industry to benefit.
- Cut Flowers (intensive horticulture): A coordinated regional-scale approach is needed to fully scope and consider the potential for developing the cut flower and intensive horticulture market on the Sunshine Coast. This should include required infrastructure and capacity/employment needs and links to freight/export associated with the airport expansion and major rail projects currently underway.

• International Broadband Submarine Cable:

The Sunshine Coast Council is facilitating a new International Broadband Submarine Cable landing at Maroochydore by 2020, which will stimulate local business, generate new investment and improve

telecommunications capacity to Australia's east coast.

- **Key transport projects**: This is a series of forums and opportunities for the RDA Sunshine Coast to advocate for existing and newly created local transport initiatives such as Bruce Highway upgrade, North Coast Connect project and the recently published Sunshine Coast Council (SCC) Integrated Transport Strategy.
- Sunshine Coast Airport expansion: RDA
 Sunshine Coast will connect the business community
 with opportunities arising from the airport expansion
 for example, the Food and Agribusiness Network
 (FAN) will explore food and agribusiness export
 openings.
- **Grants support**: RDA Sunshine Coast is actively connecting both the business and community sectors with government grants, culminating in a four-part Grants for Growth event workshop series, with event one at the Maroochy RSL on Thursday, February 7. Gambling Community Benefit Fund round 100 now open

Queensland not-for-profits can apply for grants from \$500 to \$35,000 through the Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF). This fund is Queensland's largest one-off grants program, distributing approximately \$55 million per year. Empowering Business to Go Digital program raises tech awareness


