Fostering Resilient Learners

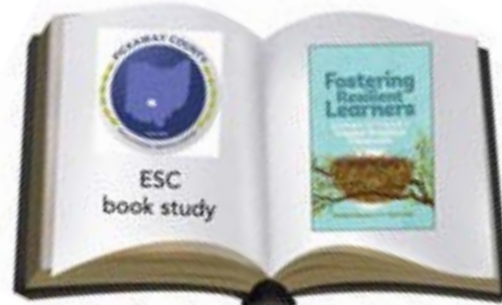
WHO?

This book study will change your classroom and provide students with positive benefits that will stay with them for years to come. ASCD has summarized the purpose of this book by Kristin Souers with Pete Hall with four strong claims:

- readers will discover what trauma is, how it hinders learning, motivation and success for students;
- readers will compare a new strength-based discipline approach to the common destructive student behavior attitude;
- readers will examine ways to build strong relationships with students and create a safe space for learning at high levels; and
- readers will look at ways to cope and remember self-care is important for you and your students.
