Editor in Chief, The Daily Aztec Oualifications

- 1. Applicants must be journalism majors who have knowledge of editorial and art production operations of a newspaper, and the Society of Professional Journalist Code of Ethics.
- 2. It is required that the editor has completed the following courses:
 - JMS 210 Social Media Digital Age
 - JMS 220 Writing for Mass Media
 - JMS 300 Principles of Journalism
 - JMS 310W Media Writing and Reporting
 - JMS 494 Media, Law and Ethics
- 3. The editor shall have knowledge of the defenses to libel: truth, fair comment and privilege and shall be able to demonstrate said familiarity in the interview.
- 4. The editor shall have knowledge of the Brown Act, public records/FOI, and prior restraint, CSU, SDSU, A.S. and Student Media Advisory Committee policies and procedures.
- 5. The editor shall be able to recognize a call for a formal correction and be prepared to respond, as the law and good judgment require.
- 6. Applicants are required to have one year of college newspaper experience or the equivalent; a minimum of one semester editing experience at *The Daily Aztec* is required.
- 7. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 60 units of college-level coursework. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 for work performed at SDSU is required. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all college-level work is required. Petitions to waive this grade point requirement must be submitted with the application materials. Applicants may not be on any form of disciplinary probation.
- 8. During the academic year of appointment, the editor is required to be an SDSU student enrolled in a minimum of six units of coursework per semester and maintain a GPA of at least 2.0.

Editor in Chief, *The Daily Aztec* Duties and Responsibilities

Under the general direction of the Student Media Advisory Committee, the EIC works closely with the General Manager to manage the day-to-day operations and develop the strategic direction of the newspaper. The editor in chief is responsible for all editorial, advertising and art production of *The Daily Aztec*. The EIC will work in coordination with the General Manager regarding budgetary issues and production schedules, among others. However, the General Manager is responsible for establishing the budget of the newspaper.

Chair of the editorial board

Responsible for day-to-day management of the advertising, editorial and art production staff

Works closely with the advertising director to ensure successful operations of *The Daily Aztec*

Answers university, public and student comments, concerns and questions on a timely basis

Ensures all editorial, advertising and art staff follow *The Daily Aztec*, Associated Students, Student Media Advisory Committee, advertising and university policies

Ensures that *The Daily Aztec* complies with the professional standards set forth in the Society of Professional Journalists Code of Ethics, university policies, and laws related to privacy and libel.

Attends weekly senior staff meetings and admin meetings.

Conducts weekly editorial staff meetings

Coordinates with the advertising director on the schedule and deadlines for special issues and sets the content deadlines for each day

Ensures that *The Daily Aztec* prepares and submits annual regional, state and national trade awards

Receives daily page allocations and advises editorial sections of space availability for each day's paper

Reviews copy each day before the paper runs

Prepares performance evaluations for the advertising director, managing editor and the art director

Reviews and gives final approval on all advertising, editorial and art productions staff performance evaluations, raises, and job descriptions

Must be enrolled in at least six units at SDSU
