Kingston's heritage is full of pranks and mischief!

Thomas Abbott was an expert china restorer who owned a shop in Kingston. He was known for breaking items into small pieces only to restore them and show off his skill.


To celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897, he created a crazy patchwork vase, then broke it into hundreds of pieces to restore.

Abbott held a competition for townspeople to guess the number of pieces the jug was made from. Kingston Museum has some great pictures of his staff dressed up as broken vases!

## Around the world

In France, people prank their friends by sticking paper fish on each other's backs. They call it 'poisson d'April', which means April fish!

In Scotland, April Fools' Day is celebrated for the first two days of April. The first day is for all kinds of pranks, but on the second (called Tailie day) people stick tails on one another.

In the UK, April Fools' Day is celebrated until noon. In 1957, BBC News pranked viewers with a story about a family harvesting spaghetti from their spaghetti tree. Spaghetti wasn't common then so people asked how to grow their own spaghetti trees!

In Germany, doughnuts called Berliners are filled with mustard on April Fools' Day, and pranksters watch as people bite into disgusting doughnuts!
